Dear Friends,

There's a story of two Americans who went to work in a Russian Orphanage in 1994. As it was Christmas they told the children about Mary and Joseph arriving at Bethlehem. Finding no room at the inn, the couple went to the stable, where the baby Jesus was born and placed in a manger. Throughout the story, the children and orphanage staff sat in amazement as they listened. Completing the story, they gave the children three small pieces cardboard to make a crude manger. Each child was given a small paper square, cut from yellow napkins.

Following instructions, the children tore the paper and carefully laid strips in the manger for straw. Small squares of flannel were used for the baby's blanket. A doll-like baby was cut from the tan felt they had brought from the United States. The orphans were busy assembling their manager as they walked among them to see if they needed any help. Suddenly they saw little Misha, who was about 6 years old and had finished his project. As they looked at the little boy's manger, they were startled to see not one, but two babies in the manger and they asked him about it.

For such a young boy, who had only heard the Christmas story once, he related the happenings accurately... until he came to the part where Mary put the baby Jesus in the manger. Then Misha started to ad-lib. He made up his own story as he said, "And when Maria laid the baby in the manger, Jesus looked up at me and asked me if I had a place to stay. I told Him I have no mamma and I have no papa, so I don't have any place to stay. Then Jesus told me I could stay with him. But I told him couldn't because I have no gift to give him like everyone else did. But I wanted to stay with Jesus so much, so I thought about what I had that maybe I could use for a gift. I thought maybe if I could keep him warm, that would be a good gift. So I asked Jesus, "If I keep you warm, will that be a good enough gift?" And Jesus told me, "If you keep me warm, that will be the best gift anybody ever gave me." "So I got into the manger, and then Jesus looked at me and he told me I could stay with him for always."

As Misha finished his story, his eyes brimmed full of tears that they splashed down his cheeks. Putting his hand over his face, his head dropped to the table and his shoulders shook as he sobbed and sobbed. The little orphan had found someone who would never abandon him nor abuse him, someone who would stay with him FOR ALWAYS. May we know the love and presence of Jesus with us, not just this Christmas, but for always.

ALZHEIMER'S SOCIETY AND YEO VALLEY LIONS

Dementia is a progressive disease of the brain and currently over 850,000 people are living with the condition, and this is predicted to increase to over a million by 2025.

In May 2017, Yeo Valley Lions was recognised by the Alzheimer's Society as a Dementia Friendly Organisation and we have progressively developed our support for the local branch of the Alzheimer's Society. Our support takes the form of Yeo Valley Lions sponsoring a monthly Information Hub in Wrington, a monthly Coffee Morning at the Youth Club in Yatton and a major Singing for the Brain Project.

Before the COVID pandemic, all of these services were well attended and we were looking to extend Singing for the Brain into a weekly event. Sadly, COVID restrictions put paid to this and all three of these activities had to cease. With COVID restrictions lifted, all three projects resumed. Progress towards pre-pandemic attendance levels has been slow. Vulnerable people were, understandably, reticent about group meetings. Also, sadly, some of those originally attending these groups have passed away. On the positive side, the vaccine started to give people confidence. We have been working with the Alzheimer's Society on changes that can be made to encourage greater participation.

The Yatton Coffee Morning Yatton Youth Club (last Tuesday in the month 10.30 to noon) has now, successfully reached and gone beyond, pre-pandemic levels and has some new members. This is a very informal drop-in group.

The Singing for the Brain Project struggled with numbers. After discussions with families the Alzheimer's Society suggested a change of venue. In October, Singing for the Brain moved from Wrington to the Old School Rooms in Congresbury. This immediately saw a fivefold increase in numbers and this trend seems to be continuing – helped by a new song book with input from the group members. This Group meets every other Thursday.

The original project from 2017, the Wrington Information and Activities Hub, has been the slowest to recover. This is an important group because it provides professional advice and also a range of activities that stimulate the brain. Base on the success of moving the Singing for the Brain Project, from February, the Information and Activities Hub will meet at Yatton Youth Club on the first Tuesday of the month (10am to noon). The annual Dementia Friendly Carol Service at All Saints Church in Wrington is on 6th December at 11.30am. Favourite carols and refreshments after the service.

PLAYGROUND



For many years, our playground at Kingston Seymour has been much used by the local families who have children with special needs and by organisations for those who support them. The COVID pandemic resulted in restrictions on the use of the Playground over the past couple of years. With those restrictions lifted, we were able to open fully in 2022.

As promised last year, we carried out some work at the entrance area, in order to overcome parking issues. This fenced off area provides some privacy and a safe area for getting children into, and out of, vehicles.

It's been good to see children and families coming back and enjoying time at the Playground. We have had many new members join and it has been particularly pleasing this year to see school groups using the Playground. I hope this will increase next year.

The Stay & Play Days organised by SENDCAS on Tuesdays of the school holidays have been well attended and, judging by the laughter of children, thoroughly enjoyed. These days have also introduced new members to the Playground. I am grateful for the help of my Fellow Lions for the inevitable repair work they do to the various toys etc, due to the enthusiastic use by children, and for the daily maintenance routines they carry out (particularly getting sand back into the sandpit following some impressive digging by the children!). We are also grateful to those families who anonymously donate equipment and help in other ways. You know who you are!

The Playground offers a safe haven for children with special needs and their families. It is designed to enable children to let off steam and have social interaction between each other in a way not possible in a traditional playground. Facilities include specially designed playground equipment that allows a carer to accompany a child on a swing or down a slide and a wheelchair swing where the child and their wheelchair can be accommodated. It also has a sandpit, a playhouse, a fort, a boat, tubular bells, various other field equipment, toys, bikes and tractors. A waterfall and a movement sensitive water feature make a calming corner of the garden. There are picnic tables, a large sun umbrella, a rain shelter and a toilet facility. Because it is a safe place, children can play safely and use their imagination, whilst adults relax.

Although the Playground is now closed for the winter, we plan to open on 1st April 2023. As always, we will keep everyone informed through our website. Over the winter, we will be carrying out work to keep the Playground in good order.

We are grateful for the positive comments made by those who use the Playground. There are seventeen pages of lovely comments in our Visitors Book, with well over a hundred comments. A selection of those comments is reproduced below. These comments are shown exactly as written in the Visitors Book:

Are met in thee tonight.


O morning stars, together

Ronald McDonald House Charities UK has been operating for 30 years since construction began on the first House in 1989. Their houses provide a place to stay when the partnering NHS hospitals whilst seriously sick children are being treated. Families staying with them can cook, play, rest and be together, all the time knowing that they are only moments away from their child in hospital. They also run activities so families and children staying with them can have a break away from the hospital ward.

To stay in one of their Ronald McDonald Houses, they must first ask the hospital to refer them. Upon receiving a room, the family will be able to stay for as long as needed. All their houses are situated a stone's throw from the hospital and have everything you would expect to find in your own home; en suite bedrooms with a phone line directly linked to the hospital, a kitchen and communal areas, and some have outside space.

How does the Lions Bus benefit the elderly?

One of the most significant benefits offered is several local shopping trips. Below shows our current trip schedule

- Every Tuesday morning, pickup from Yatton/Claverham/ Cleeve to either Clevedon Tesco or Nailsea Waitrose.
- Every Thursday morning pickups from Yatton/Claverham/Cleeve to Yatton Precinct (Co-op & Post Office)
- Alternate Friday mornings: from Yatton/Claverham/Cleeve to Weston-Super-Mare Sovereign Centre

Wherever possible the minibus will come to your front gate, so there's no need to struggle to a bus stop. There is no charge for these shopping trips, but donations are of course always welcome to help cover the running costs!

Additionally, we provide a pickup service on the first Wednesday of each month for attendance at the Lions Coffee morning at the Youth Club in Rock Road, Yatton and on the third Wednesday of each month to attend the Lions Lunch Club at Yatton Rugby Club.
